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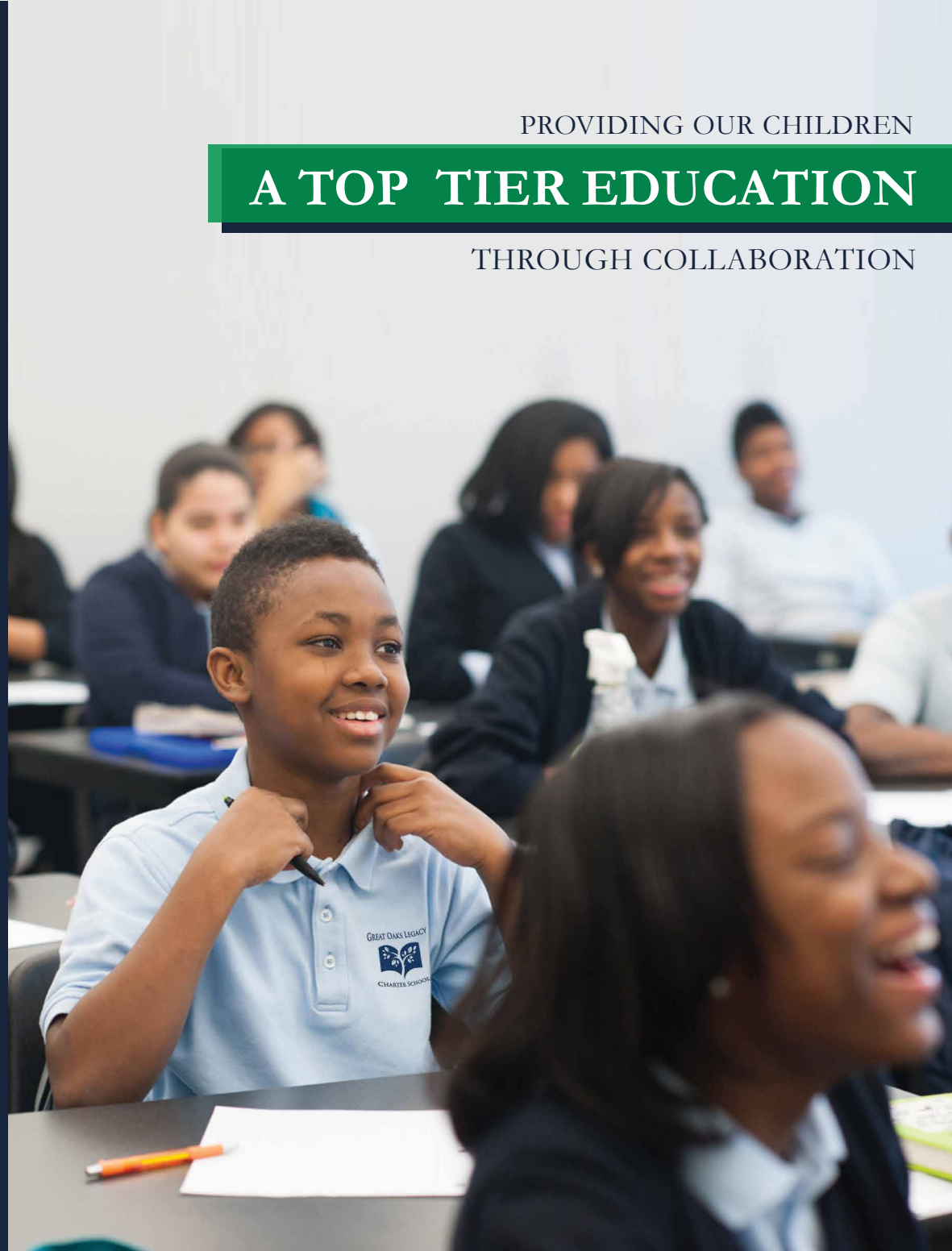

School Mission

The Great Oaks Legacy Charter Schools' mission is to prepare students for college success. We are a Pre-K to 12th grade network of schools that serve 1,300 students across the city of Newark, New Jersey, where less than 10% of students are on-track to graduate in college. Great Oaks Legacy achieves its mission through differentiated academic support for all students, the creation of a supportive community built on love, and an environment characterized by high expectations. Great Oaks Legacy Charter High School helps students reach their college goals by creating a culture of resilience where each member of the community has the courage to be excellent.

School Community

The school community at Great Oaks Legacy is defined by our belief in individual relationships with students and their families. We build these relationships in part through our Tutor Corps, a unique urban education fellowship that recruits recent college graduates to come to Newark to support students through high dosage tutoring. English and mathematics tutorial is aligned to school curriculum and built into each students' schedule for two hours a day and tutors are responsible for logging thousands of proactive phone calls to parents each year. The Tutor Corps enables a community that is built upon genuine and meaningful relationships with students. With a surgical approach to differentiation of instruction and support, students are emboldened to exceed high expectations for academic growth and character development, in preparation for post-secondary success and career mobility.

Students enroll into Great Oaks Legacy Charter School through a free, public lottery system which is open to families who live in the greater Newark area. Currently, GOLCS serves approximately 1,300 in grades PK-12. Of the school's 327 high school students in 2017-18:

- 83% identify as Afri. American, 15% identify as Latino, 1% identify as White, 1% identify as Asian, and 1% identify as Multiracial
- 90% are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch
- 100% of our first graduation class were admitted to college last year.

SAT AVERAGE SCORES

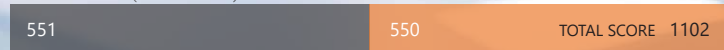
Great Oaks Legacy - Class of 2018 (75% Tested)

Graduation Requirements

Great Oaks Legacy Charter School requires each student to complete 4 credits in English, Science, Mathematics and History. Additionally, students must earn 2 credits in a foreign language, 3 credits in physical education/health and 1 credit in the arts. Each course is worth 1 credit except for physical education, which is .75 credits and art is .5 credits.
